

# DJ tells millions that Natalie is 'one' for him live at Knebworth

HE is best-known for presenting his popular morning show on Bay Radio at the weekends. But DJ Pep was heard by millions when he asked his girlfriend to marry him two years ago — live on Radio One at Robbie Williams' 2003 Knebworth concert.

DJ Pep, 32, who's been with the Bay four years, says he'd met travel agent girlfriend Natalie, 25, three years ago while doing a live broadcast for his show.

The pair clicked immediately and within just four months, the DJ knew he'd met the girl he wanted to spend the rest of his life with.

Knowing Natalie was a huge fan of Robbie Williams he decided to propose to his sweetheart at the singer's famous Knebworth concert in 2003, which was being recorded for TV and was going out live on Radio One.

DJ Pep recalls: "I'd been working in a club the night before so we drove down to the concert at about 3am and were one of the first of 150,000-strong crowd to get there — so we ended up right in front of the stage."

He proposed to Natalie at the concert, before Robbie came on stage, and was de-

lighted when she said yes. But when he saw some Robbie Williams flyers lying on the floor afterwards he came up with an idea to make the proposal extra-special. He explains: "Robbie is Natalie's favourite popstar and I thought I am going to try and get him to dedicate a song to her."

He scribbled his message to Robbie on one of the flyers and managed to get it to the star on stage via a security guard.

A few songs later, DJ Pep says: "Robbie read out my message saying that we'd just got engaged at the concert and he asked me to propose again live on the radio, which I did, and then he sang the song *She's the One* for Natalie."

It was an unforgettable day for both Natalie and Pep, who says: "Next day we appeared on television and in the newspapers."

"But what it shows is that if you see an opportunity like that to do something special for someone you love, then you should take it. All it takes is a bit of initiative."

He finishes, only half joking: "Now we are working on getting Robbie to sing at the wedding!"
