Pep said it was unfair that Morecambe was being left out and he and his fellow DJ wanted to try to persuade the BBC to change its mind in time for next year.

He said: "We feel sorry for the youngsters who won't see a roadshow this year, or maybe never again."

Pep, who with Jay works at Crystal T's and the Carleton Inn in Morecambe, said everything was being taken away from the resort.

He said: "When we read that it wasn't coming

to Morecambe, we thought that if we don't do something about it now it will stay away for ever.

"It has always brought in thousands of tourists for the day and they won't come if the roadshow isn't there.

"We want youngsters to write letters supporting the campaign to bring it back and we will take them down to London and kick up a fuss. We want to let Radio One know that Morecambe wants a roadshow."
