Although both scored high marks the day's celebrity guest, Jim Bowen of Arkholme, scored a perfect 10 out of 10 although allegations of rigging were rife.

Broadcast via satellite to nine million listeners across the country the roadshow again proved that love it or hate it, its popularity shows no sign of waning.
